SWIWSCO currently address,

One half of Tanzania's population is below the age of 18 and up to 60% of the children live in desperately poor conditions with little or no access to education, healthcare, food, shelter or legal assistance. While many of the children are orphaned due to loss of both parents, a significant number are categorized as orphans due to the death or abandonment of one parent. The remaining parent or other caregiver, most often a woman, struggles to support the family on less than \$1.00 a day.

Children's vulnerability to poverty, adversity and HIV/AIDS is largely contextual but also indicative of the widespread need to protect them. Currently there are over 2.5 million orphans in Tanzania, over the next decade this number is expected to rise and this will increase the number of children living in poverty, alone on the streets with no support, no education or food and at higher risk of becoming involved in drugs and other illegal activities.

The rise in the proportion of orphans and vulnerable children means a rise in percentages of the illiterate, early pregnancies, and related consequences such as increased infant and maternal mortality rates,



increased incidence of sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) and HIV/AIDS, and drug abuse. The cycle of child poverty will thus be passed on to next generation and become chronic

SWIWSCO aims to improve the lives of all vulnerable children. We believe that all children deserve the right to live and grow in a safe and secure environment. The focus in 2012-2015 is to stabilize the funding stream in support of the children's and women project. Through fundraising, small projects, donations and global support we believe this is possible.

SWIWSCO's goals,

Main objective;

Improve the quality of life for vulnerable collectives, women and children, in Tanzania Mainland.

Specific objectives;

1. Reduce the number of street kids in Tanzania mainland by providing secure shelter.
2. Providing community level support for OVC to ensure protection and well being in the home
3. Assist women and children achieve a better future with educational, Microfinance and vocational support.
4. Create a farming system which will help supply nutritional resources for the orphanage in order to increase the self sustainability of the project itself.
5. Implement an internal organizational system which will start new relationships with the professional Moshi community in order to reduce the local unemployment.

SWIWSCO's Projects,

Children Project;



SWIWSCO provides three meals each day for the children living at the home as well as staff. SWIWSCO is dedicated to providing nourishing meals to help the children be active and grow into healthy young adults. SWIWSCO is working hard for a sustainable future through different projects such as a vegetable garden



and farming goats, pigs and chickens.

SWIWSCO staff provides full-time care for 29 orphans who reside at our residential home, amongst our children health and medical issues often arise. SWIWSCO ensure all children have access to health care and medical assistance when required.

Weekly food costs and living expenses such as food, health care, water and electricity are significantly increasing. We are seeking to partner with local businesses that are able to provide stable financial support for our children, Building new relationships between SWIWSCO and the surrounding community.

Currently 5 out of 54 children supported through SWIWSCO receive sponsorship covering cost of education. Volunteers recently provided valuable time and financial support to modify SWIWSCO's website. This has enabled greater opportunity for the global community to provide sponsorship for children, in 2012-2015 SWIWSCO aims to have sponsorship covering costs of education and/ or clothing and food for all children and youth who access SWIWSCO services.

SWIWSCO is seeking donors support permitting SWIWSCO to further develop of our women's program. Our aim is to attract skilled volunteers who will assist us develop programs and provide training for local staff to deliver family life skills training, health and wellbeing information and vocational training for disadvantaged mothers and young women. SWIWSCO believe providing awareness and support for women will assist women secure their livelihood and is a vital in reducing the number of orphans and vulnerable children living on the streets or in extreme poverty.

Over the past 5 years SWIWSCO has developed great friendships with many international volunteers. Some volunteers have returned and many continue to stay involved, all have expressed great appreciation in being able to see the children grow healthy and doing well. SWIWSCO continue to maintain strong relationships with our volunteers and seek to welcome new skilled volunteers to contribute to our goals. SWIWSCO has been working the last years with Art in Tanzania an international NGO based in Tanzania based on educational and cultural development, which provide us with human and economical resources.

SWIWSCO is dedicated to developing stronger relationships within the local community and obtaining ongoing support from local businesses.

The organization is currently seeking an additional Mama caregiver to help provide care, cooking and washing for the orphans who live at SWIWSCO. With additional resources SWIWSCO is hoping to provide more holistic services.



Over the coming years SWIWSCO and volunteers hope to provide more employment and training opportunities for local people, further contributing to the local economy.

Women Project:



Currently SWIWSCO Planed to training and supporting fifty (50) women with financial to improve their daily life and their children future, SWIWSCO believe that if you empower one women you will be empower the whole family and community in general, SWIWSCO seeking for sponsor, local and international to support women project, you can donate online through our website or seek instruction how to contribute from our members and staffs.

Pig Project:



SWIWSCO currently owns 15 pigs. The goal is to buy, sale and raise these pigs in an effort to create a source of income for SWIWSCO. The project has been established by personal funds of the SWIWSCO board members. The pigs live on SWIWSCO grounds and are maintained by the children and staff. The pig project is still in early stages of development. As the project progresses we will be sure to add updates.

Goats Project:



SWIWSCO has thirteen goats. They will be used to produce milk for the children. The goats are kept on SWIWSCO grounds. They are easily maintained as they graze on the grasses in front of the orphanage. There is little to no cost to SWIWSCO in order to keep the goats. The goats are cared for by the SWIWSCO



staff and children. Eight goats were donated by our Volunteer Mr. Michael Weldon from England on October 2011, thanks to Michael, friends and family who make that happened.

Garden Project:



SWIWSCO's garden is currently being restored by the hands of volunteers, staff and SWIWSCO children. The seeds to plant new fruits and vegetables will be donated by volunteers. The garden is located on SWIWSCO grounds. The garden is used as a source to provide nutritious food to our children. This is also an effort made to help cut cost due to the fact that half of our budget is spent on food. The garden seed and equipment has been donated by our Volunteer Mr. Michael Weldon from England thanks to you, your family and friend.

Painting Project:



The Art Project is the newest edition to the SWIWSCO Project's. The project is being ran and operated by board members and volunteers. SWIWSCO was able to find a local painter willing to donate his time and artistic abilities to paint 100 canvases in an effort to raise money for the children. The SWIWSCO children have helped Immanuel, aka Issa the artist construct the frames for the canvases. The paintings will be sold to local tourist, volunteers and anyone else interested in supporting SWIWSCO.
